DISSERTATION GUIDELINES

The dissertation of the BALLB/BBALLB X Semester students shall be under guidance of Supervisors allotted to them. The students are required to keep in touch with their supervisors and meet them, at least once in a week, as per the convenience of the Supervisor and the student concerned to give updates to their progress. This year the topics and supervisors have been allocated well in time so that the students have sufficient time to work on their dissertation.

The students are required to prepare **three** hard bound copies of the dissertation — two copies must be submitted in the office. One copy should remain with the respective students, which they must bring with them at the time of viva.

The students will be required to submit synopsis of the dissertation and one rough draft and the final draft of the

dissertation, which should be prepared strictly in consultation with the supervisor.

This is the final work of 5 years' in the USLLS. Please ensure strict adherence to the research ethics and maintain the highest standards of academic research in your work, which will remain against your name always. The dissertation should be original and free from plagiarism. The University reserves the right to reject the dissertation and initiate appropriate action if the dissertation is found plagiarized.

Research Guidelines

Synopsis head—

- Topic of dissertation (approved in consultation with the supervisor)
- Introduction
- Identification of research problem
- Relevance of the topic chosen for the research
- Literature review
- Research objective
- Research questions/hypothesis
- Research methodology
- Chapterization with brief description
- References/Bibliography

Final dissertation should consist of the following—

- Cover page consisting of the title (at the top), name of the University enrolment number, name and designation of the supervisor (in middle), University logo, name of School and University at the bottom
- Declaration by the student about the originality of work
- Certificate issued by the supervisor
- Plagiarism check certificate — please refer to UGC (Promotion and Academic Integrity and Prevention of Plagiarism in Higher Educational Institutions) Regulation 2018. Plagiarism check should be done through Urkund or Turnitin. Maximum permitted limit for similarity must be within stipulated standards of the above regulation.
- Acknowledgement
- Table of contents
- List of abbreviations
- Table of cases
- Main body of the dissertation should be divided into chapters, with first chapter on Introduction and last chapter on Conclusion and Suggestions.
- There should be annotated reference list/bibliography consistent with the style of referencing followed, along with appendix. The reference list/bibliography and appendix should not be counted for the required number of total pages of dissertation.
- The main text of dissertation should be of 75 to 100 pages excluding reference list/bibliography and appendix,

Formatting of the dissertation

- Each chapter should have a title, which should be center justified and placed two inches from the top, in uppercase.
- All pages must be numbered with the preliminary pages marked in Roman numbers, and the main chapters, annexures and references/bibliography in Indo-numeric style, beginning from page number 1. All numbers should be placed in the bottom, center of the page.
- Dissertations should be typed in 12 font size, footnote in 10 font size, with double spacing, in Times New Roman style, justified alignment.
- Margin of the left should be 1.5 inches, with top, bottom, and right-hand margin at 1 inch.

Ops

- Footnoting and citation should be based preferably on JILI (w.ili.ac.in), 10' Times New roman Style, with single spacing and justified alignment. The style of referencing must be consistent throughout.


