Subject: Observance of World Malaria Day – 25 April, 2026

It is informed that as per communication received from the District Surveillance Unit (DSU), South-West District and State Programme Unit, Delhi under the National Vector Borne Disease Control Programme (NVBCP). World Malaria Day is to be observed on 25th April, 2026.

The day is observed globally to strengthen awareness about malaria and to promote collective action for its prevention, control, and eventual elimination. The theme for the year 2026 is:

"Driven to End Malaria: Now We Can. Now We Must."

In this regard, all Deans/Directors/Branch Heads/In-charge are requested to undertake awareness and preventive activities in their respective Schools/Branches/Units. The following activities may be carried out:

- i. Promotion of cleanliness and elimination of stagnant water to prevent mosquito breeding.
- ii. Display and dissemination of Do's and Don'ts for malaria prevention.
- iii. Utilization of awareness sessions, health talks, quizzes, poster-making, and slogan-writing competitions for students and staff.
- iv. Organization of awareness sessions, health talks, quizzes, poster-making and slogan-writing competitions for students and staff.


Further, the following specific actions shall be undertaken:

- i. The Director of Students' Welfare (DSW) is requested to organize a Poster Making Competitions on the theme of malaria awareness.
- ii. The University Information Technology Services (UITS) is requested to upload the Circular along with relevant awareness content on the University website.
- iii. All Deans/Directors/Branch Heads are requested to ensure display of awareness material on their respective notice boards.
- iv. The Sanitation and University Works Department (UWD) Branches are requested to instruct their officials and outsourced staff to strictly follow the prescribed guidelines and take necessary preventive measures accordingly.

All concerned are requested to ensure wide publicity and active participation.
